### Drop-off point is private property

*The following was sent to Jerry F. Cammarata, chairman of the Transportation Advisory Committee for Community School Board 31.*

During the past few weeks, various members of our community have expressed their increased concern for the safety of children commuting to PS 4. We, too, share this concern.

The Board of Directors of the Village Greens Residents Association ... strongly request that a drop-off/pick-up zone be established for parents whose children are not eligible for school bus service to and from PS 4. We further request that this zone be located along Arden Avenue from Hampton Green to Nedra Lane.

This location offers a long strip of curb area for waiting cars and a sidewalk to the school which does not pass any curb cuts or vehicular crossings. School crossing guards have designated posts at this corner; therefore, these guards can continue to oversee the safe passage of the children to and from the school building ...  
The walkway from Hampton

Green into Nedra Lane leading to the entrance of PS 4 is private property belonging to the Village Greens Residents Association.

The Association has always been, and will continue to be, legally liable for this walkway, as well as responsible for its repairs and upkeep. This means, too, that the homeowners of the Village Greens Residents Association pay for all expenses associated with the entire walkway area, including insurance and maintenance.

We vehemently oppose any attempt to officially designate this walkway area as a drop-off/pick-up zone for anyone or any organization that is not a member of our Association. ...
