Actress Zsa Zsa Gabor said she was handcuffed and made to sit in a Beverly Hills, Calif., street while a police officer arrested her for allegedly slapping him after he pulled over her white Rolls-Royce.

Miss Gabor was booked for investigation of evading a policeman, battery on a policeman, driving without a valid license, driving an unregistered car and driving with an open alcoholic container, a police spokesman said.

She was released yesterday afternoon on her own recognizance.

Miss Gabor told the authorities she struck the officer in self-defense. "You just cannot drive a Rolls-Royce in Beverly Hills anymore because they have it in for you," she grumbled.

In January, police in Atlanta escorted Miss Gabor off a Delta Airlines flight after she refused to keep her dogs in travel kennels.
